The college offers Degree (Hons. & Pass) Courses in almost all subjects of Arts and Commerce and General Courses in all Subjects.

The college is located in the Latehar Jharkhand and is spread in vast area of 84 acres (approx) equipped with beautiful greenery, good infrastructure and facilities. There are additional facilities of nationalized bank (SBI) and Post Office within the campus. The nearest railway station is Latehar.

Banwari Sahu Mahavidyalaya got established in 15 April 19847 under the aegis Under Society Samajik Chetna And Saikshnik Vikas Sansthan, Act 21, 1860. The Institute is Affiliated to Nilamber-Pitamber University, Medininagar, Palamau (Jharkhand). ## **1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY**

### **Curricular Aspects**

Our college is a permanent affiliated Unit of Nilambar-Pitambar, Medininagar, Palamau, Jharkhand. The college is recognised under 2(f) of UGC act 1979. The college develops action plans for effective implementation of curriculum. However the college has little scope in redesigning the syllabus at its own level as it is prepared by the Nilambar-Pitambar University Medininagar, Palamau. For effectively communicating the curriculum and improving teaching practices, the college teachers are encouraged to participate in national and international seminars in the country and abroad. Through the department meetings with heads, faculties, principal and IQAC, it coordinates plans to develop teaching methods through the discussions and departmental seminars. The college analyses the objectives of the curricular through its internal examination, class test, discussions, etc. It also organizes Community Orientation Programmes, Aids awareness, Drug abuse awareness, Cashless transaction awareness programme for payment, and Environmental issues.

The college strictly adheres to the academic calendar prepared by the University. All the events and the celebrations of the days are evenly placed. The prospectus carries all the information and is systematically made with clarity and simplicity. The College is running Under-graduate Programmes for Arts and Commerce, and 5 certificate course. The curriculum at UG level is designed and developed by the University. The College implements the guidelines of the University regarding the curriculum and completion of the course. The University has made the provisions of curriculum for Honours and Generic elective courses. The lesson plan is prepared by the teachers in consultation with the principal of the college. The feedback is taken and analysis and action taken report uploaded in institutional website.

The College follows the Semester System of examination. The committees have been formed to handle gender issues and environmental issues. A good number of awareness programmes and seminars have

been organized. The programmes have been organized with care and made to suit the rural and predominantly SC/ST/OBC population. The outreach programmes have been well executed by the help of NSS.

### **Teaching-learning and Evaluation**

The college strictly follows the university guidelines in the admission process. The selection for admission is done by the university on merit basis. The college provides quality education in various disciplines of arts and commerce including job oriented self-finance certificate courses. The institute follows the national commitment to diversify and inclusion by improving access to SC/ST/OBC, minorities, weaker sections, and women. It strictly follows the reservation policy of government of Jharkhand providing reservation to SC/ST/OBC and PH. The college also sensitizes its staff and students on issues, such as gender, inclusion and environment, encouraging to participate in the refresher courses, workshop and seminars. The college has also women, gender and environment cell to sensitize its students. There are one NSS unit in the college, which sensitizes above mentioned issues. The institution identifies and responds to special learning needs of advance learners through class room teaching, discussion, test and quizzes. The College monitors the progress and performance of the learners through continuous evaluation method. The Curriculum Outcome (CO) and Learning Outcome (LO) are as per the prescribed curriculum of the University. The College has co-education, where in female learners are more than male learners. The medium of instruction is Hindi and English. Dropout rate of all the programmes is very low. Pass percentage of learners is satisfactory. There are 17 Teachers 21 Non-teaching staff looks after the administrative work.

The motivational training and talks are organized for effective the learning process. The college prepares teaching plan making lesson plan with the consultation of the concerned departments. The IQAC always active role by assuring quality of teaching and learning in the campus. The college develops and promotes the nurturing of critical thinking and creativity through the cultural and extension activities, quizzes and debates. The college has grievance and redressal cell, women cell, career and counselling cell, and discipline cell which support and guides the students. Our teachers participate in workshops, seminars, conferences, research activities to enrich knowledge and teaching new curriculum.

### **Research, Innovations and Extension**

Our principal is also a member of university academic council. The IQAC was also formed to improve the quality of research and imbibe research culture in the campus. Our faculties are involved in research activities by becoming a member of research committees, supervising students, attending seminars and conferences, taking minor research projects, and writing in peer review journals and chapters in edited books. The college has library and Wi-Fi with computer facilities for students and teachers for research activities in the campus. Our college has vocational courses, which is equipped with computers and Wi-Fi, projectors. Many students of this college have visited many organization for job training. For extension activities, we have NSS units in the college, where students and teachers actively participate in various programme. The College has initiated some work on creation of ecosystem for nurturing innovative ideas of students and faculty members. The College ensures good connectivity between students and community. The concept of social responsibility/ social commitments has been inculcated among the students by organizing various extension activities viz: awareness

programme for education, cleanliness campaign, vote casting awareness, plantation, water conservation, AIDS/HIV awareness programme, drugs de-addiction campaign environmental protection and health awareness programme, cashless payment, environmental issues, literacy programme, and Swach Bharat Abhiyan etc.

As far as research facility is concerned, the teacher have orientation to research publication, and participation. 8 teachers have published their papers in UGC Care list journal. The college has organized a national Seminar and special lecturer Series. The college has produced MoUs with different organizations, according to MoU lecture series has been organised. The college also organises social awareness programme, road safety awareness, sanitary napkin use awareness, and health and hygiene awareness under its extension activities. The College is offering 12 undergraduate (UG) Programmes under the faculty of Arts, 02 under graduate Programmes (UG) under the faculty of Commerce. The faculty members are guiding the students for the seminars and various competitions.

### **Infrastructure and Learning Resources**

The institution has computer aided teaching/learning materials for its staff and students like computer, Wi-Fi, projector, LCD TV, duplicator machine, Xerox machine, printer, scanner etc. The teachers of this college have done computer refresher course organized by the parent organization at the College, premises. The college has class rooms, laboratories, library, computer room, Wi-Fi facilities, RUSA and IQAC room. The library has more than 10000 books and journals. Our college is well equipped with computer, Wi-Fi, printers, Xerox, projector, and scanner. The college has library Advisory Committee which coordinates and looks after the library and its development. The college has generator, stand by inverter and batteries, projector, scanner, Xerox machine, duplicator machine, which are connected to all departments. The college has ICT aids like computer, Wi-Fi, projector, LCD TV, duplicator

Machine, Xerox machine, printer, scanner etc. These device do help us in learning among the students and enhances the teaching capacity of the teachers. Along, various programmes and workshop are also organised, time to time, enhance the teaching and learning process.

The institution has a well maintained, user friendly and resilient infrastructure conducive to teaching, learning and comprehensive development of students. The Institution has two storage building consisting of 12 classrooms, and separate administrative building consisting of 08 office rooms. Teaching Block has well-equipped and spacious classrooms, tutorial rooms, department rooms, Geography Lab, Psychology Lab, Library cum reading room. A well-furnished smart Class room with smart board. The Seminar hall equipped with projectors so that ICT can be used for strengthening academic discourse. There are one computer/ ICT lab consisting of 14 computers available for the students. 04 Xerox machine is also available. All offices have 08 computer Equipment, internet connectivity to support for administrative work. The campus is Wi-Fi enabled for the benefit of students and faculty. The College has very good Library at ground floors, Wi-Fi enabled and has 30 seating capacity. CCTV Facilities available for safety and security of the college. The Administrative Block of the college consists of the Principal's Office, Examination Office, Teacher Common Room, IQAC, NSS, Section Office, Account Office, Admission office, the magnificent Seminar Hall, which for Academic events like conferences, seminars, talks etc. and student activities, for physical challenge students, RAMP and Wheel Chair facilities are also available. Canteen facilities for student and staff in the college premises, guard room

and generator room, parking facilities, seek room is also available. Separate toilet for Staff, students (Boys and Girls)

### **Student Support and Progression**

The students of our college are the primary stakeholders. We encourage students for developing core values for contributing in the national development and creating a global competencies. The college also provides financial assistance to SC/ST/OBC, and PH students in the formal scholarship. The fee concessions to the weaker section is also provided. The college takes various steps to encourage the participation of students in extra-curricular and co-curricular activities like sports, game, quizzes, debates and other cultural activities. Providing value-based education besides along with regular university syllabus to inculcate human values among the students and staff through programmes like prevention of sexual harassment, anti-ragging, and personality development. The college has also Grievance and Redressal Cell, Discipline Committee, Equal Opportunity Centre, which ensures a conducive and secured environment for growth and development of students.

The representation of the NSS volunteer, cultural, sports activities, and rank holders from each class in various activities help in leadership development of the learners. The Teachers identifies student related issues and problems and helps the College administration through meetings and effective dialogues in resolving those. The Principal, Bursar and the Controller of Examinations provides the necessary help to organise, sports events, debate and elocution competitions which are held regularly. Scholarship and free-ship facility is available. Nearly 40% students are benefitted from this scheme. Banwari Sahu Mahavidyalaya, Latehar has also in registered an Alumni Association. The Alumni Association account has been opened and 5000/- contribution has been contributed till date. Alumni Association meetings are regularly organised. They provide the professional guidance to the students.

### **Governance, Leadership and Management**

The policies and plans are formed after consultations with different committees, Principal and other Administrative in charge of our college. The college has mechanism to monitor effective and efficient use of available financial resources through various committees by the delegation of powers. The College follows a policy of decentralization and participatory management system. The IQAC has been constituted on 18-04-2017. IQAC plays proactive role in ensuring teaching-learning and administration of the College. Teaching and non-teaching staff are involved in implementation of the decisions for the benefit of the students. Eligible and competent staff is engaged by the management. The College has organized internal and external audit regularly. Accountant General's (AG) audit is conducted. The College has been granted permanent affiliation by the Department of Human Resource Development, State Government of Jharkhand. The Governing Body (GB) is the controlling and managing authority of the College. The College is grant-in-aid by the State Government and therefore EPF Scheme is made applicable to the staff. In addition to this the college management also provides medical facility and

advance against the requirement to the employees. The service rules prescribed by the State Government are equally applicable to the staff.

The institution always keeps running for free of Poverty, Corruption, Terrorism, Communalism and Castism, Which is collaborated with National Service Scheme's "Cleanliness Drive" for a week under the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan. The college also organizes the events to commemorate the birth and death anniversaries of famous personalities like Mahatma Gandhi, Shaheed Bhagat Singh, Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan. The events include lecture by eminent speakers from diverse fields and conducting inter college competitions like Essay writing, Slogan writing, Poster Making, Cleanliness Drive. The system of education in the classroom shows that the institution provides better education to the rural area students.
